CA Statutory Role of K-12 Education

- EC 66010.1. The purpose of this article is to identify common educational missions shared by educational institutions in California and to differentiate more specific missions and functions between the various educational segments.
- 66010.3. The public elementary and secondary schools shall be responsible for academic and general vocational instruction from kindergarten and grades 1 to 12, inclusive, including preparation of pupils for postsecondary instruction, future participation in California's economy and society, and adult instruction to the extent of state support.

Career Technical Education

In 2012-13, over 132,000 Riverside County high school students were enrolled in CTE courses.

32.4% made it at least half-way through the sequence (grades 9-12.)

18.6% completed the course sequence and capstone class in high school—others completed in community college.
